



Recent Developments in International Arbitration

Malaysians are active users of international arbitration and have consistently ranked among the top 10 foreign users of the Singapore International Arbitration Centre ("SIAC").

In the 2018 Queen Mary University of London and White & Case International Arbitration Survey, Singapore was ranked the third-most popular seat in the world, and SIAC ranked third out of the world's top five arbitral institutions.

In 2017, the international community entrusted SIAC with a record 452 new case filings, and SIAC saw a broad spectrum of users from six continents encompassing 58 jurisdictions. Increased cross-border commercial activity across Asia and the Belt and Road Initiative, will result in a further increase in international disputes in Asia.
