Arun Kasi will speak on the London Maritime Arbitrators Association (“LMAA”) Terms 2021, the LMAA Intermediate Claims Procedure (“ICP”) 2021 and the LMAA Small Claims Procedure (“SCP”) 2021 — the latest sets of major maritime arbitration rules that came into effect on 1 May 2021. He will deal with both the procedure and practice in conducting LMAA arbitrations. He will also make reference to the practice of conducting arbitrations virtually, which is gaining popularity during the COVID-19 era.

Arun Kasi will make a brief visit to the challenge procedures available under the UK Arbitration Act 1996, where the arbitration is conducted with an English seat, which is different from those in the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (“UNCITRAL”) model law or the Malaysian Arbitration Act 2005.

Speaker



Arun Kasi is a practising lawyer in Kuala Lumpur with a focus on maritime law. He is a member of the LMAA, and is an arbitrator in the panels of Asian International Arbitration Centre (“AIAC”) and Thailand Arbitration Centre (“THAC”). He regularly appears before all levels of courts and arbitral tribunals. He has written numerous books and articles on maritime law and arbitration published around the world.
