About the Speaker

Brendan Navin Siva is a B Ec / LLB graduate of the University of Sydney and was called to the Malaysian Bar in 1999. Brendan is the Chairperson of the Subcommittee on Advocacy Training Course of the Bar Council Professional Standards and Development Committee. He has conducted training sessions in Kuala Lumpur, Penang, Malacca, Johor Bahru, Kuantan, Muar, Alor Setar, Kuching and Kota Kinabalu.

In 2013, Brendan was elected to the Executive Committee of the International Advocacy Training Council, as the Malaysian Bar's representative. Brendan was the first Malaysian to be invited by the General Council of the Bar of South Africa to join their international faculty of advocacy trainers for the Advanced Advocacy Training Course at the Wallenberg Centre, Stellenbosch in January 2014. He was also the first Malaysian to be invited by the South Eastern Circuit Bar Mess Foundation to join their international faculty of advocacy trainers for the Advanced International Advocacy Course at Keble College, Oxford in August 2014.
